PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The single most important message that the Foundation can share with the people of Prince Edward Island is this: "Your tax dollars do not buy equipment for the Prince County Hospital". Since 1993, when I first became involved with the Prince County Hospital Foundation, being the year of its founding, we have failed to enunciate that message clearly and consistently. The facts are – "Government does not buy equipment for the Prince County Hospital".

During my time of association with the Foundation, I have had the pleasure of watching our supporters grow Prince County Hospital from the old facility on Beattie Avenue to our new facility which has become a center of health care excellence on Prince Edward Island.


It has been our many donors – literally from across the Province, who have made the level of service and the caring support available at Prince County Hospital. The only equipment funding resources that are available to us come from the generosity of our donors. Each year, the Foundation receives a list of much needed equipment from the Medical Advisory Committee at PCH we often think, "maybe this is the year that we won't be able to meet our goal". And not meeting our goal means not buying equipment. However, again in 2009, the generosity of our donors has surpassed our expectations, contributing over 1.1 million dollars in a combined effort to ensure that the patients at PCH have access to the best equipment available.

As your Board continues to look towards the provision of new equipment, expanded services, faster access, and the incorporation of an electronic health record that will contribute to the safety and security of all patients, we are ever mindful of the fact that Government does not participate in the acquisition of these gifts. Many of our municipalities are "major donors" which means that they make a three year commitment to provide financial support for the purchase of equipment that will serve their citizens. But the Prince Edward Island Government and the Federal Government do not participate in equipment purchases at Prince County Hospital. Instead, it is incumbent upon your Board of Directors and our many volunteers to continue to grow and expand with programs like Major Gifts, Planned Giving, Special Events and Activities that ensure that all Islanders are given the opportunity to participate in supporting the financial needs of our Hospital.

As we look forward to 2010, it is my hope that we will once again be able to reach our financial and other goals. It will again be a challenging year, both economically and otherwise; but it is also one that is filled with opportunities to expand and grow the services that we can offer as a hospital. This year we welcome the Foundation's incoming President, Bill Thompson. Bill brings a wealth of knowledge and experience to the role and will no doubt lead the Foundation in continuing partnerships with staff, volunteers, donors, hospital administration, government and the many folks who contribute in many ways to the success of this facility.

As we speak to our families, neighbours, friends and business acquaintances, it is important that we remind them that the equipment that is purchased for our hospital can only be bought through their generosity. We know and understand the message. It is important that we share it so we can ensure that we continue to attract the very best physicians, nurses, technicians and staff to provide health care services for the folks in our communities.

MESSAGE FROM PCH EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, ARLENE GALLANT-BERNARD

It gives me great pleasure to reflect and report on the activities for Prince County Hospital during this past year. I am very proud of the staff and physicians who work at Prince County Hospital and want to thank them for their continued commitment to providing quality services to our community.

Each year we have a long list of medical equipment needs and this list gets reviewed and prioritized by a committee consisting of staff, physicians, representation from the Hospital Foundation and the Hospital Auxiliary. We want to thank the community for their generous support in raising funds required to purchase medical equipment. Without your support we would not be able to maintain the level of services using the quality of equipment that we have available to use. Thank you to the PCH Medical Equipment Committee for their great work in reviewing and prioritizing this list.

The electronic clinical information system continues to be implemented across the province. Prince County Hospital has certainly lead the way in many areas by rolling out modules and I want to thank the staff for their engagement. Staff and physicians have embraced this new technology in a very positive manner and are working hard to ensure that our electronic health record will enable us to provide better patient care.

Diagnostic Imaging wait times continue to decrease in CT Scan (Computed Tomography), Echocardiography and Ultrasound. The implementation of digital equipment (i.e. digital mammography), centralized scheduling and extended hours have improved access and will continue to do so over the next year. The breast screening program has been reviewed and 150 appointments added each week (total for both PCH and QEH) therefore wait times have started to decrease.



The Model of Care Pilot Project on the Medical Unit began in October 2009. Patient Care Workers were introduced as part of the nursing team to support patient care. Our goal is always to provide safe, quality patient care while optimizing the skills and knowledge of all team members.

In closing, thanks so much to you, our community for your ongoing support to Prince County Hospital. Every year we are humbled by the amazing financial support we receive from you. We truly are blessed with this wonderful community and your generous support.

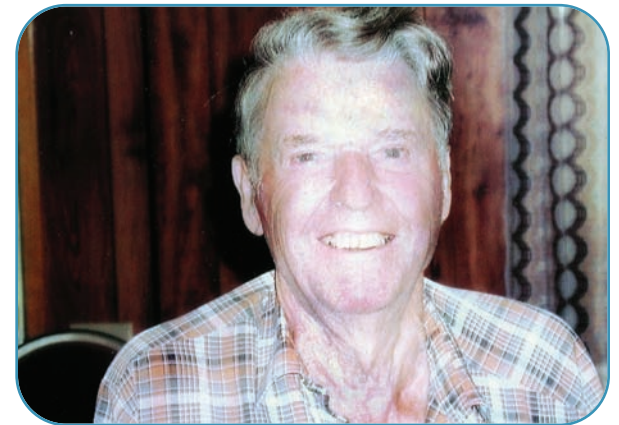
ENDOWMENTS 2009

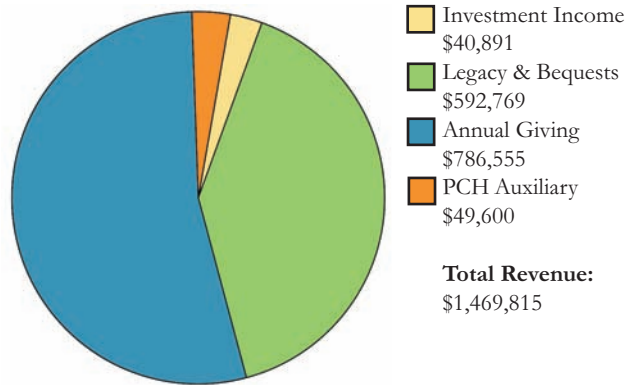

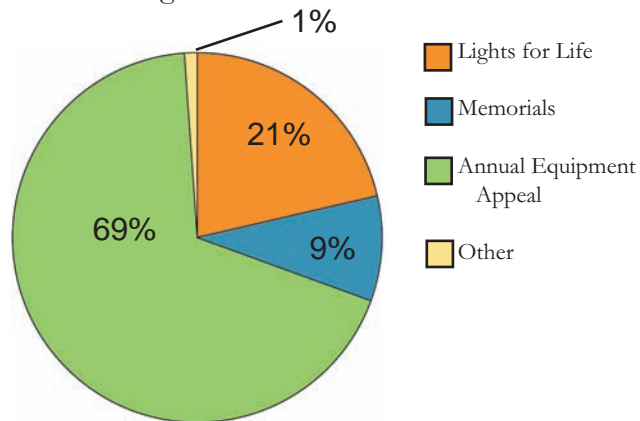
